

Dual Credit Eligibility

- Students complete the entire admissions process plus a enrollment permission form for registration at Collin College
- Available with permission from your high school each semester for every course
- Must meet college readiness standards as defined by Texas Success Initiative (TSI) (more details to follow)
- Students are held to the academic standards laid out in the college catalog



- HS and Collin calendar may be different
 - You follow the Collin calendar
 - Holidays may vary
 - Collin College may hold classes at the high school building is open, even when high schools are not in session (ex: teacher work day)
 - If the high school site is not available, professors may make arrangements for online assignment or hold class at Collin campus
 - Weather closings--if the location where your class is held closes, you do not have class




- FERPA and Personal Responsibility
 - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
 - Federal law that ensures privacy of student educational records (begins when student starts college regardless of age)
 - Collin cannot share grades, course schedules, test scores, etc. with parents
 - Students' opportunity to gain new responsibilities and act on his/her own behalf

- Collin College deadlines for Drop/Withdraw
 - Listed in Collin College registration guide
 - Drop is before the term's census date and will not appear on college transcript
 - Withdraw is after term's census date and will appear as "W" on college transcript, does not affect GPA
 - Must complete paperwork on Collin campus
 - Impact on graduation
 - Discuss with your HS counselor





3. Official High School Transcript

- Collin needs the most recent high school transcript for every student.
 - Does not have to include final spring grades
- May include test scores for TSI exemptions/waivers.
- May include vaccine records.
- Follow your high school's specific steps to request one.



4. Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination

- State Law (SB 1107) requires all students under the age of 22 entering a higher education institution to provide proof of having the vaccine or document an exception or exemption.
- This is an admissions requirement for Collin College and should be completed before registration.
- May sign Request for Exception if taking courses on HS campus only (purple form in packet).

- ACT/SAT scores must be sent from the testing source directly to Collin College if not provided on your HS transcript
- STAAR scores will be on your high school transcript if applicable

- Scores must be on an official document from the high school (e.g. transcript or high school letterhead).
- Waivers are only needed for the subject you want to take. (e.g. you only need a waiver in reading and writing to take ENGL 1301, HIST 1301)

Texas Success Initiative (TSI)

- The TSI is designed to measure competency in reading, writing, and mathematics. Students need a status in all subject areas.
- It is used for placement purposes.
- Students must be at college level in reading and writing for the majority of courses.



- Most math and some science and technical courses require college level in math.
- See the college catalog for placement and prerequisite information.



TSI: What will I need to do?

- Complete Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA) online and print certificate of completion (a link to the PAA will be emailed to you at the time of admission)
- Print testing referral emailed to you at the time of admission or obtain a testing referral from Admissions and Records or Academic Advising with a photo ID.
- Pay the cashier, cost is \$29.
- Walk in to test with any campus Testing Center. You should bring your testing referral, receipt, a picture ID, and PAA certificate of completion.
- See an Academic Advisor to review your results.



What if my TSI scores are low?

351	Essay score of 4 and multiple choice of 363	350	

- You only need college level placement in the areas needed for your course (e.g. ENGL 1301 requires college level in reading and writing but not in math)
- Mandatory Advising (MA) hold
 - Will be on your account if you place below college level in at least one area
- If you do not place at "college level" in the areas required for your course that means you need to focus on your high school work at this time.

Dual Credit Enrollment Procedures

COLLEGE Students must act on their own behalf. Photo ID is required for all transactions at Collin College. Please COLLEGE consult the Concurrent/Dual Credit manual at www.collin.edu/dualcredit for program restrictions.

The following steps must be completed in order

- 1. Apply (returning students may skip to step #6 after providing #2 High School Student Enrollment Form)
 - Complete the Collin College application online at https://apply.collin.edu
 - You will receive an email from admissions@collin.edu when your application has been received.
 - Congratulations and welcome to Collin Collegel You will shortly receive an email from admissions@collin.edu with your CougarWeb username and password. Please follow the steps below prior to registration.

2. High School Student Enrollment Form

- This form is required on file at Collin College for <u>each semester</u>. Please visit with your HS counselor for approval
 and to pick up this form. It must be signed by a high school official (e.g. high school counselor), student, and
 parent/quardian if the student is under the age of 18.
- Follow your high school's procedures regarding where to turn in the form: directly to the Collin College Admissions and Records Offices or to the Collin College Special Admissions Coordinator.

3. Official High School Transcript

 Students are responsible for providing an official high school transcript to Collin College. Follow your high school's specific steps to request one.

4. Bacterial Meningitis Vaccine

- Submit proof of vaccine or if taking classes on a HS campus only, submit an exception form to Collin College Admissions and Records Office via email to admissions@collin.edu, fax to 972.548.6702, or hand deliver at least three days prior to registration
- Other exceptions and exemptions are available. Please visit www.collin.edu/meningitis for details

5. Testing Information


- All students must test or provide proof of exemption/waiver. If you believe you have a full or partial
- exemption/waiver, please provide <u>official</u> scores and see Admissions and Records (see back for details).

 If you do not have an exemption/waiver, you will be required to take the **Texas Success Initiative (TSI)**.
 - Complete the Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA)--a link will be emailed to you during the admissions process or you can find it at the following: https://www.collin.edu/preassessment
 - Print your certificate of completio
 - Bring testing referral (emailed to you or picked up from Academic Advising) to Cashier's Office and pay \$29

6. Register for Courses Online

- Go to <u>Add or Drop Classes</u> once logged into CougarWeb
 - Select Fall 2016 Credit term
 - enter your specific CRN for your designated course as listed on your high school course sheet
- Use <u>Look Up Classes</u> to enroll in general population courses on a Collin campus (if approved by your counselor)
- Detailed instructions can be found on your high school course sheet

Enrollment Verification

- Must enroll in the subjects on your enrollment permission form
- Prefer another subject? Turn in a new form!
- Limitations:
 - No 3 week May, Wintermester, PHED outside of the core, or developmental level courses



Fall 2016 Important Dates

- You can apply online at apply.collin.edu beginning now!
- Registration is available starting April 19th
- Prosper ISD's deadline: registration should be complete by Tuesday, June 21st
- Fall semester is August 22nd December 11th


8. Get Books

- You may purchase books from your preferred retailer.








